活動計劃

- 前言

輔仁大學醫學院為國內第一所於三、四年級全面應用以問題為基礎的學習(Problem-based Learning, PBL)的課程設計理念及學習方法於基礎及臨床醫學知識的學校，除醫學系外更推廣至護理學系、臨床心理學系等單位，並於校院內及評鑑受到相當的認可，至今已實施近十年。經過多年的實行經驗，學生對於 PBL 的學習上均發展優秀的自我學習能力及解答能力。

我們也同樣發現，在就學期間所學到的案例仍為少數，疾病並非一成不變，隨著時代的演變，我們可以發現同樣的疾病會有不同的變化，更甚至有許多前所未見的疾病不斷的產生，因此僅仰賴 PBL 的學習是稍微不足的。因此我們希望能藉由現有的學習方法研擬出一套強化其優點補足缺點之方案，

經過研究的探討及國內外相關的交流後，我們認為國外現正推廣實行的且有很好的成效的臨床表徵 (Clinical presentation, CP) 將有助於增進學生的學習。CP 的課程設計與教育理念主要是由 120 個症狀組成的。廣義的說，它可以是一個症狀、臨床表徵或是實驗室數據的異常。每一個 CP 會將相關的基礎醫學融合進去。而學生則需要做問題解決的計畫，以達教學及臨床診斷的邏輯訓練。
