- 二、TWC過去三年(2010~2012)每年獲保德信金融集團資助，提供獎學金(全名為：Prudential Foundation Global Citizens Program)予印度、日本、韓國及臺灣等四個亞洲國家學生(每年共25或26名)來華府實習及上課，過去三年分別有7名、6名及7名臺灣學生獲選來美，本組每年均協助TWC洽排此二十餘位學生至本代表處參訪，反應良好。
- 三、該計畫較之前略有變動：如原僅春季計畫，現改為春、秋兩季、原25或26名學生來自印、日、韓、臺四國，未來每季將自前四國再加上巴西與中國大陸中挑選學生，每批20人，每年共40人。本次公告之明年春季計畫大致內容為：

學生將於明年1~5月停留華府（共15週），該中心將安排集體住宿，一週4天白天赴其安排之機構實習與主修及興趣相關之事務，另將安排學術課程，授課教師來自大華府區知名大學，如喬治城大學（Georgetown University）及約翰霍普金斯大學（Johns Hopkins University）等，另每週一安排參訪或演講等行程。本案資助每位學生申請費、學費、住宿費、簽證費（J1簽證）、保險費及來回機票費（上限為1千美金）等，我學生自付額僅為膳食費等小額支出。詳請參見附件所附本案計畫簡介及申請通知（含電郵共4頁）。

The scholarship covers most expenses including: application fee, program and housing fees, J-1 SEVIS visa fee, health insurance, and an airfare allowance.

Interested students should complete and submit the following documents before **September 15th, 2012**. The documents must be submitted in English.

1. Online Application Form (<http://www.twc.edu/internships/learn-more/application>)
2. One-page Résumé
3. 500-word Issues Essay talking about a current event in the field of business, management, finance or entrepreneurship
4. 100-word Statement of Professional Interest indicating the type of activities students would like to be involved with during the internship and how they relate to their career goals
5. Two Letters of Recommendation (one of which must be provided by a faculty member)*
6. Official Transcript from university showing a GPA at least 3.0 on a 4.0 scale (or equivalent)*
7. TOEFL Exam (80 or higher on the Internet-based test) or official equivalent exam, waived in certain cases*
8. Copy of the first page of Passport*

** Students must complete all application components to be considered, and when they are ready to submit their application, they should contact internationalinfo@twc.edu in order not to pay the application fee.*

Program Dates: The program begins on January 30th and ends on May 10th, 2013

Program Components

This program provides students interested in learning more about the financial role of the private, government, and nonprofit sectors in the U.S. and around the world an opportunity to work and interact with experts in areas such as business, corporate social responsibility and ethics, and the intersections of business and government. The program has the following components:

- **Internship:** students will be placed in an internship with an organization that fits their interests and skills. Students will intern four days a week.
- **Academic Course:** students will complete an academic course. TWC's faculty includes adjunct professors from local universities including Georgetown and Johns Hopkins University, among others.
- **Monday Programming:** students will attend a series of events with experts and leaders from the private, public, and nonprofit sectors.
- **Civic Engagement Project:** students will devote a minimum of 15 hours over the semester to active learning and action to become well-informed about an issue they care about, then work to make a positive difference in public life at the local, national or global level.
- **Portfolio:** students will produce a compilation of documents that chronicles and summarizes their learning experience during your time with The Washington Center.

Prudential Foundation Global Citizens Program

Global Citizenship, an important 21st Century Skill

In today's 21st century economy it is increasingly important for students entering the business world to have a global understanding and recognize the ever changing role government plays in affecting business decisions. The Prudential Foundation Global Citizens Program provides international undergraduate or graduate students from India, Japan, South Korea, China, Taiwan and Brazil the opportunity to spend a semester in Washington, D.C. in an experiential education program that exposes them to the role the United States government plays in the context of an increasingly interdependent world. In light of the increased role of regulation in the United States economy, this program exposes selected students to the financial role of the private, government and nonprofit sectors in our nation's capital. Students in the program return to their communities equipped with the skills and motivation to make real impacts as civically engaged, socially aware citizens.



The program will enable 120 students in 2013, 2014 and 2015 from universities in selected countries around the world to spend a semester together in Washington, D.C., acquiring the skills and understanding needed to become responsible global citizens. These students will join a cohort of 400-450 students from across the United States and around the world. They will live together in shared apartments and have an opportunity to learn from their internships and academic components, and from each other.

A total of forty (40) students, twenty (20) for the spring semester and twenty (20) for the fall semester, will be selected each year from universities in the following countries:

- Brazil
- India
- South Korea
- China
- Japan
- Taiwan

Program components

The fifteen-week Prudential Foundation Global Citizens Program will have the following components:

1. Internship: The Washington Center matches students, according to their interests, with substantive internships. Placement sites could include private companies, government agencies, nonprofit and nongovernmental organizations. These internship placement sites may include, but are not limited to those involved with:
 - Economic trends
 - Regulatory and oversight issues
 - Globalization
 - Small business ownership and entrepreneurship
 - Corporate social investment strategy
 - Financial literacy
 - Monetary and fiscal policies



- Consumer credit
- Business and ethics
- Diversity in management and leadership
- Financial and banking services

Examples are AGCO, American Enterprise Institute, Asia Society, Atlantic Council of the United States, Cato Institute, Center for American Progress, Center for Strategic and International Studies (CSIS), Corporate Executive Board, Embassy of South Korea, Financial Services Roundtable, Institute of International Education, U.S. Chamber of Commerce, U.S. Small Business Administration, U.S. Korean Business Council, Alliance for U.S.-India Business, U.S.-Asia Institute, Voice of America, among many others. Students work four days per week.

2. Academic Course: All participants in this program attend an academic course one evening per week. The course helps students understand development theories, business and trade models as well as relevant policy-making processes.

3. Leadership Forum: The hallmark of TWC's programming is its Leadership Forum, which

includes the Alan K. Simpson-Norman Y. Mineta Leaders Series, Public Policy Dialogues on Capitol Hill, and the Roundtable on Philanthropy and Social Responsibility. The Leadership Forum is designed to help students reflect on their professional leadership development through presentations and interactions with prominent leaders.

4. Programming: In addition to The Leadership Forum, students in the Prudential Foundation Global Citizens Program participate in a series of enrichment activities outside of their internship. Students participate as a group in a series of tailored lectures, site visits, workshops, and cultural events. Examples of past events for students have included:

- Visits to the Millennium Challenge Corporation with address by Dr. Franek Wiebe, Chief Economist, the U.S. Department of Commerce International Trade Administration, and embassies such as India and the Republic of Korea
- Participation in the Model UN-Asia Pacific Economic Cooperation (APEC) simulation seminar
- Career Boot Camp with over 10 different professional development workshops

5. Portfolio: Students produce a compilation of documents that summarizes their learning experience, including a goal statement, various reflective assignments, papers and work samples.

In addition, The Washington Center offers:

Mentorship: TWC's Program Advisors mentor and work closely with students to ensure all their expectations are met, including all program tasks. TWC's housing facilities have Resident Assistants that supervise students during the evenings and weekends.

Eligibility Requirements

- Be enrolled in (or hold a bachelor's degree awarded by) an accredited university from one of the participating countries.

- Have a grade point average of at least 3.0 on a 4.0 scale (or equivalent).
- Demonstrate proficiency in written and spoken English.
- Demonstrate an interest in global community development through their academic background or community/campus involvement and discuss their qualifications in the essay.

Application Components

The application consists of the following (all documents must be provided in English):

- The online application form
- An official transcript
- Two letters of recommendation (one of which must be provided by a faculty member)
- A one-page résumé
- An internship request statement
- A 500-word essay
- TOEFL score of 80 or higher. This is equivalent to 550 on the paper-based scale
- Phone interview with The Washington Center staff

Scholarship Coverage

Students will receive a scholarship that covers application, program and housing fees, J-1 Visa Sevis fee, health insurance and airfare up to 1,000 dollars.
