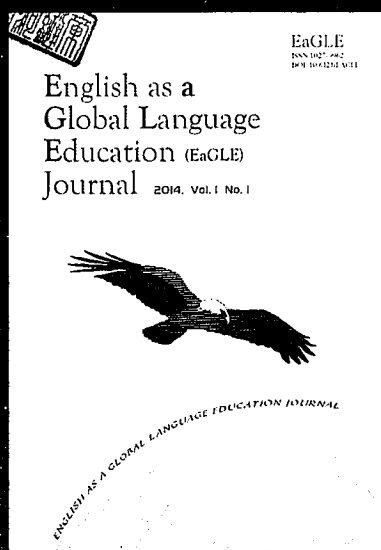

- *Manuscript Length*: 5,000~8,000 words, including appendix, acknowledgement, references, notes, figures, and tables.
- *Manuscript Format*: (a) typewritten, double-spaced throughout (including bibliography, notes, citation, figures, and tables); use a 1.5-inch left margin, and 1 inch elsewhere; (b) refer to your own previous publications in the third person, and thus not “as I said in...,” but “as Chen (2012) argued...”; (c) refer to an institution where the study was conducted or where the author teaches as “Institution X” during the refereeing process, to retain anonymity; and (d) all electronic submissions must be formatted for American, letter-sized paper (8½ × 11 inches) using 12-point font and in MS Word, WordPerfect, or RTF (rich text format).
