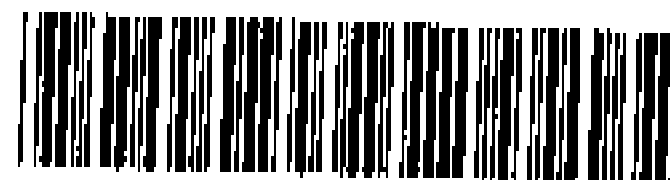

格式

1. 中英文稿件格式請參考附件一及二。
2. 來稿皆應有中、英文之題目、摘要（400 字以內）及關鍵詞。
3. 請另頁註明中英文之作者姓名、所屬機關名稱及職稱，並附通訊地址、電話及傳真號碼或 E-mail address。
4. 來稿一式兩份（以 A4 紙列印稿）並附磁片，磁片檔案請以 WORD 7.0 以上版本打字，作者請自留底稿。

審查、校對及致酬

1. 來稿依其性質送請該領域之學者、專家匿名評審；若審查通過，並經本學報編輯委員會議通過後，始予刊登。
2. 來稿審查通過後，將以專函通知，請作者於期限內繳交校對或修改後之文稿。
3. 未獲採用之文稿將以專函通知作者，原件恕不退回。
4. 經刊登之著作，本學報不給付作者稿費，但致贈當期學報二冊及抽印本二十份。

文責、著作權及出版權

1. 作者應注意與著作權法相關的各項規定，引用資料應註明出處。文稿若涉及一稿數投或侵權事宜，概由作者自行負責。
2. 作者享有著作權，出版權歸本校所有，非經本校同意，任何人或機構均不得重製或發行。

AUTHOR'S INSTRUCTION OF JOURNAL OF MACKAY COLLEGE

Submission

Manuscripts should be written in English or Chinese. They should be submitted in triplicate (with three sets of illustrations, of which one is original), typewritten double-spaced on one side of the paper (size approx. 21 x 28 cm), with 3-cm margins. The final version of your manuscript and illustrations should also be submitted on disk. For details refer to Disk Submission. Editorial review and copy-editing will be executed from the disk version of your manuscript. Resubmission of a rejected manuscript should be addressed to the original receiving editorial office.

Conditions

All manuscripts are subject to editorial review. The manuscript must be accompanied by a cover letter stating that the submitted work is not currently under consideration elsewhere and that all authors have seen and approved of the submission of manuscript for consideration of publication in Journal of Mackay College. Manuscripts are accepted for review with the understanding that persons cited for unpublished work have approved such citation. Authors may provide the names and contact information for three or four suggested reviewers for the manuscript.

Manuscripts which do not comply with the ethical standards recommended by the Helsinki Declaration will not be accepted for publication. The editors realize that the use of anesthetics, analgesics, and tranquilizers would defeat the purpose of some experiments. However, the use of painful or otherwise noxious stimuli must be carefully and thoroughly justified in the paper.

It is the author's responsibility to obtain permission to reproduce illustrations, tables, etc. from other publications. The paper should comprise title page, Key Words, Abstract, Introduction, Materials and Methods, Results, Discussion, References, tables, figure legends, and figures in this order.

Short Communications:

Short Communications are short articles that represent important new insights or major advances in biomedical science or the description of a novel biomedical methodology. Manuscripts submitted as Short Communications must report original and definitive research of significance to biomedical science. Follow the same outline, omitting headings except for Key Words, Abstract and References. Limitations are 5

manuscript pages (about 1,000 words) in length (including references and illustration), a maximum of 7 references, and 1 illustration.

Copyright

Publications are copyrighted for the protection of the authors and the publisher (Mackay Medicine, Nursing and Management College). A Transfer of Copyright Agreement will be sent to the author. The form must be completed and returned to the publisher before the article can be published.

Arrangement

Title page: The first page of each paper should indicate the title, the author's names, the institute where the work was conducted, and a short title for use as running head.

Full address: The exact postal address of the corresponding author complete with postal code must be given at the bottom of the title page. Please also supply phone and fax numbers, as well as e-mail address.

Key Words: For indexing purposes, a list of 3–10 key words in English is essential.

Abstract: Each paper needs an abstract not exceeding 200 words.

Introduction: This section should not be labeled, but should begin on a new page. It should contain a clear statement of the aims of the reported work. A brief account of the background of the work may also be given in this section.

Methods: This section should contain explicit, concise descriptions of all new methods or procedures employed. Modifications of previously published methods should be described. Commonly used methods require only a citation of the original sources. When methods are described, the description should be such as to enable the reader to judge their accuracy, reproducibility, and reliability and to repeat the experiment.

Results: This section ordinarily contains the experimental data to be presented, but not extended discussions of their significance. Results should usually be presented in graphic or tabular form rather than discursively in the text. Graphic presentation of data is often preferred, but there should not be duplication in tables and figures. Sufficient data must be given to allow readers to judge variability and reliability of the results.

Discussion: This section should discuss the significance and implications of the results and present conclusions to be drawn from the results. Speculative discussion is not discouraged, but the speculation should be based on the data presented and identified as such. The Discussion should be as concise as possible, within the limits of ideas the authors wish to propose and adequate discussion of related work by others.

For Short Communications, the Discussion may be incorporated into Results, heading as Results and Discussion.

Acknowledgments: These may be included at the end of the text of the manuscript. Grant support, if any, should be listed in this section.

Footnotes: Avoid footnotes. When essential, they are numbered consecutively and typed at the foot of the appropriate page.

Tables and illustrations: Tables and illustrations (both numbered in Arabic numerals) should be submitted separately. Tables require a heading and the figures a legend. The Legends should be prepared on a separate sheet. Abbreviations in the legends should conform to those in the text. For the reproduction of illustrations, only good drawings and original photographs can be accepted; negatives or photocopies cannot be used. Due to technical reasons, figures with a screen background should not be submitted. If possible, group several illustrations on one block for reproduction (max. size 180 x 223 mm) or provide crop marks. On the back of each illustration, indicate its number, the author's name, and 'top' with a soft pencil. Ballpoint pen should not be used. Electronically submitted b/w half tone and color illustrations must have a final resolution of 300 dpi after scaling, line drawings one of 800-1,200 dpi. Photomicrographs should be calibrated on the print by adding a calibration bar. Any labelling should be done on copies, not on the prints. If any tables or illustrations submitted have been published elsewhere, written consent for republication should be obtained by the author from the holders of the copyright (usually the authors and the publishers).

Statistics, Measurements

Statistical tests used and the data analyzed should be explained so that the findings can be interpreted and evaluated. Wherever possible, statistical probability (p) in tables, figures, and figure legends should be expressed as * $p < 0.05$, ** $p < 0.01$, and *** $p < 0.001$. Scientific measurements should be given in SI units.

Drugs

Generic names should be used in text, tables, and figures. Trade names in upper case may be mentioned in parentheses in the first text reference to the drug but should not appear in titles, figures, or tables. The chemical nature of new drugs must be given when it is known. The form of drug used in calculations of doses (e.g., base or salt) should be indicated in *Methods*.

Abbreviations

When an abbreviation is to be used in the manuscript, it is to be defined in the text the first time it is used. Abbreviations for commonly used substances should be those recommended by the Journal of Biological Chemistry. Abbreviations for drugs/chemicals may be used if properly defined with the chemical or generic name when the abbreviation is first used. Excessive use of abbreviations in the text, however, is strongly discouraged. Most abbreviations are used without punctuation, with no distinction between singular and plural forms.

The abbreviations, or their properly prefixed multiples or submultiples (e.g., kg, g, mg, microgram [μ + g], ng, pg), listed below may be used without definition in text, tables, and figures.

References

Literature cited should be prepared according to the Numbered/Alphabetized style of the Council of Biology Editors. References should be cited by number, in parentheses, within the text (only one reference to a number) and listed in alphabetical order (double spaced) on a separate sheet at the end of the manuscript. Do not recite names of authors within the text.

Journal citations in the reference list should contain the following: (a) surnames and initials of all authors (surname precedes initials). Preferably, please cite all authors; (b) title of article; (c) journal title abbreviated as listed in the *List of Journals Indexed in Index Medicus*; (d) volume, inclusive pages, and year.

Book references should be in the following order: author, title, editors, name of the book, city of publication, publisher, pages and year.

Examples:

(a) Papers published in periodicals:

Hong SJ, Chang CC. Hyperpolarization of denervated skeletal muscle by lemakalim and its antagonism by glybenclamide. *J Pharmacol Exp Ther* 259:932;38;1991.

(b) Papers published only with DOI numbers:

Theoharides TC, Boucher W, Spear K: Serum interleukin-6 reflects disease severity and osteoporosis in mastocytosis patients. *Int Arch Allergy Immunol* DOI: 10.1159/000063858.

(c) Book references:

Baylis PH, Robertson GL. Physiological control of vasopressin secretion. In: Baylis PH, Padfield DL, eds. *The Posterior Pituitary: Hormone Secretion in Health and Disease*. New York, Dekker, 119;54;1985.

(d) Monographs:

Matthews DE, Farewell VT. *Using and Understanding Medical Statistics*, ed 3, revised. Basel, Karger, 1996.

No more than four references should be cited in support of any given point. The authors are responsible for the accuracy of such citations and are urged to take utmost care in proof-reading the citations and the reference list.

Page Charges

Mackay Medicine, Nursing and Management College will bear all expenses involved in publishing accepted articles.

Galley Proofs

Unless indicated otherwise, galley proofs are sent to the address given for correspondence and should be returned with the least possible delay. Alterations made in galley proofs other than the correction of printer's errors are not accepted.

Reprints, Free Subscription

Order forms and a price list are sent with the galley proofs. Mackay Medicine, Nursing and Management College will supply the corresponding author with two free copies of the relevant issue and 20 copies of reprints.

- 一、 來稿請依中英文題目、中英文作者姓名（需註明所屬機關及職稱）、中英文摘要、中英文關鍵字、正文、附錄、引用書目之順序撰寫。
- 二、 以 APA 格式撰寫，若領域不適合，請參考下列格式。
 - (一) 字型：中文使用新細明體，英文使用羅馬體(Times New Roman)。
 - (二) 字型大小：題目 20P 字；作者姓名 12P 字；本文 10P 字；註解 8P 字。
 - (三) 版面設定：
 1. 字距：標準格式。
 2. 行距：固定行高，行高 18P。
 3. 段落縮排：0.75cm。
 4. 邊界：上 2.54cm，下 2.54cm，左 3.17cm，右 3.17cm。
 5. 與頁緣距離：頁首 1.5cm，頁尾 1.75cm。
 6. 紙張：A4。21cm*29.7cm。
 7. 段落間距：6pt。
 8. 頁碼：置中。
 - (四) 文章標號：中文文章以壹、一、，(一)，1.，(1)，i，(i)；西文文章則以 I，A，1.，a，(a)，為大小標題的順序。
 - (五) 分段及引文：
 1. 正文每段第一行第一字前空兩格。
 2. 直引原文時，短文可逕入本文，外加引號。
 3. 獨立引文較長，每行第一字均空三格，不外加引號。
 - (六) 文字編排：

橫向（由左至右）排列並請用新式標點符號。「」用於平常引用；『』用於引號內之引號；《》用於書、報、期刊；〈〉用於論文及篇名；（）用於夾註。惟在正文中，古籍書名與篇名連用時，可省略篇名符號，如《史記·項羽本紀》。
 - (七) 註釋
 1. 註釋在正文之中，置於標點符號之後，在引文則置於引文標點符號之後。
 2. 隨頁附註，每註另起一行。
 3. 註釋號碼採橫式阿拉伯字上標法，如¹²³，均置於標點符號之後。
 4. 註釋內之引用文獻第一次出現時，出處資料須全部列舉，第二次以後可用簡略方式表示之。中外文並存時，依中文、日文、西文順序排列。

5. 引徵專書請依序註明姓名，次列書名、出版地、出版者、出版時間、版次及頁碼。常見古書可免作者，惟涉及版本者請特別註明。

7. 引徵報紙文章，須列明作者姓名、篇名、報名、出版地、出版時、版(頁)次，如：
王之春，〈覆武昌保電〉，《華字日報》，香港，1905 年 1 月 20 日(光緒 30 年 12 月 15 日)，版 1。
8. 引徵檔案文件，須列明文件名稱、時間、檔案名稱、收藏機構、類號、文件性質，如：
「外交部呈行政院」(民國 35 年 1 月 11 日)，〈中葡簽訂平等新約〉，《行政院檔案》，國史館藏，檔號：0641.20/5044.02，微捲：53-1874。
9. 其他注意事項
 - (1) 在文章篇名後打*號，提謝辭。在作者姓名後打**號，作者簡介。
 - (2) 如用及前引書、前引文、同上註者，請均改為作者，篇名，頁碼，不需重複出版項。如余恩德，《中國禁菸法令變遷史》，頁 230-231。
